- recognized by the UN in 2010 as a fundamental human right
- essential for life, health, and dignity
- requires safe, accessible, and affordable water for all
- life without water is not possible
- the right to water is inextricably linked to the right to life and human dignity
- water is a resource that must be available, physically available and accessible




III. generation of human rights
