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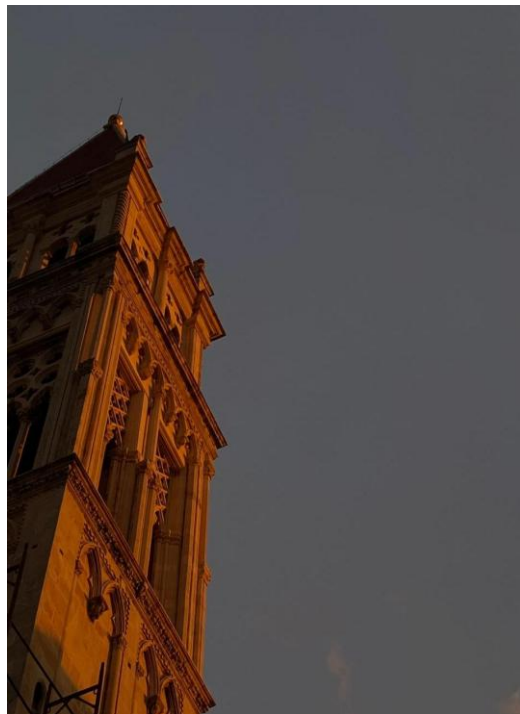
**You can see a central square Ivana Pavla II in Trogir featuring a stone clock tower, typical of historic towns in Dalmatia. In front of the tower is an open loggia with stone columns, as well as several cafe tables set on the paved square. The architecture is mainly Renaissance and Baroque, built from stone characteristic of coastal Dalmatian towns.**



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**This is the cathedral of Saint Lovre in Trogir. It began construction in the 13th century and is built in the Romanesque style of architecture. It is built by the master builder Radovan, and is today under UNESCO's protection.**



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**Kamerlengo Fortress is a large, old stone fort in Trogir, Croatia. It was built in the 1400s when the town was under Venetian rule, and it served as a military base and lookout point over the sea. The fortress has tall walls, round and square towers, and big open spaces inside where soldiers once trained.**

**Today, it's a popular place for visitors. People can walk along the walls, climb the towers for great views of the harbor, and explore the open courtyard. In summer, the fort is sometimes used for events like concerts and shows, which gives it a lively atmosphere even though it's centuries old.**

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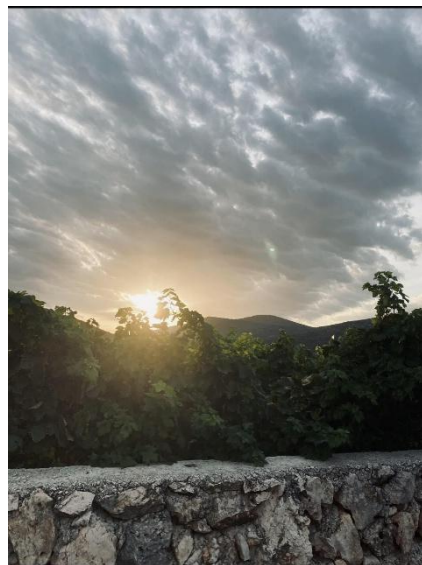
